Why Chief Residents Should Attend

Individuals selected to be chief residents frequently possess natural ability to function in this role but often receive little or no formal training in management and leadership skills. Much of the stress and burn-out commonly experienced by Chief Residents may be attributed to this lack of formal education and support.
